**When the French National Railroad wanted to bid on a Maryland State contract, Ellen Lightman knew she needed to make her voice heard.** After all, this was the company that transported her grandparents, and tens of thousands of Jews, to the death camps during the Holocaust.

Working with the Baltimore Jewish Council (BJC), she went to Annapolis to testify for a bill, which passed, that said companies must open records of their World War II actions in order to bid.

Concerned again this year about the power of anti-Israeli organizations, Ellen returned to Annapolis with BJC. She testified to include language in the state's budget condemning the American Studies Association's academic boycott of Israeli institutions.

"BJC uses its voice to advocate for issues that matter to the Jewish community from Israel and anti-Semitism to inter-religious and intra-communal issues. We all benefit from their work," she says.
