TWO ASSOCIATED AGENCIES NAMED MOST INNOVATIVE IN THE COUNTRY

Slingshot Guide Highlights the Best In Jewish Nonprofit World

Baltimore, MD – Two Associated: Jewish Community Federation of Baltimore programs and agencies – the JCC's Charm City Tribe and Pearlstone Center – have been named as North America's top 50 innovative Jewish organizations in the 11th annual Slingshot Guide released today. The 2016 Slingshot Guide, the foremost comprehensive resource into today's most significant organizations, projects and programs of the North American Jewish community, was released today.

Charm City Tribe and the Pearlstone Center were selected from among hundreds of finalists reviewed by 93 professionals with expertise in grant-making and Jewish communal life. The organizations included in the Guide are driving the future of Jewish life and engagement by motivating new audiences to participate in their work and responding to the needs of individuals and communities as never before.

Charm City Tribe is a community effort for 20/30's living in downtown Baltimore looking to tap into Jewish culture and tradition in creative and meaningful ways. The Guide described Charm City Tribe as an innovative and engaging community "providing 20s and 30s young adults living in downtown Baltimore with new, creative ways of tapping into Jewish tradition and culture."

Pearlstone Center, which was named for the fifth year in a row, was selected for this list because of its unique approach to outdoor environmental education through its community-oriented farm.

"The Associated and its agencies are always looking for innovative ways to engage Baltimore's Jewish community, and we are thrilled to be recognized for our groundbreaking work.
